





Figure 1: The framework





Meet the 2025 CPD Framework

A map of 11 interconnected professional practices grouped into three key areas.

It's a context-neutral yet context-responsive tool, adaptable to your unique teaching environment in Ukraine.

The professional practices

Subject knowledge, pedagogical knowledge and the knowledge base for each professional practice are fundamental for good teaching:

Knowing the subject

There are three professional practices that inform the decisions you make about teaching and learning in relation to where you are working, who you are teaching, and how you see yourself as a teacher now and in the future:

Understanding my context

Understanding my learners

Understanding and developing my professional identity

There are three professional practices that describe general teaching and learning processes:

Planning lessons and courses

Managing the lesson

Assessing learning

There are four cross-cutting professional practices:

Using digital technologies

Using inclusive practices

Using multilingual practices



Four Stages of Teacher Growth



Development is a <u>spiral</u>, not a ladder.

You can enter or re-enter any stage as your context evolves.



Understanding: You know what the professional practice is and why it is important, and have started to include it in your teaching.

Engagement: You demonstrate your understanding and confidence in this professional practice in areas of your work.

Integration: You demonstrate a high level of competency in this professional practice, and this consistently informs what you do at work.


Example: Flipped Classroom

The **flipped classroom** reverses the traditional teaching sequence:

Before class: students learn content with *input materials* (e.g., videos, readings, slides, podcasts).

During class: time is used for *interactive, communicative, and higher-order tasks,* applying, analyzing, and creating with the content.

This approach shifts the teacher's role from knowledge provider to facilitator and guide.



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Using 21st century skills / core skills 2

Application to the CPD Framework

Knowing the subject

The teacher must understand language content and pedagogical principles

Example:

A teacher designing a video lesson on "Polite Requests in English" needs to analyze <u>language function</u>, register, and <u>form</u>, ensuring explanations and examples are accurate and level-appropriate.

Understanding and developing my professional identity

The flipped classroom challenges traditional teacher roles, shifting from "lecturer" to "coach." Teachers must reflect on their <u>beliefs</u> about control, authority, and learner autonomy.

Example:

After trying a flipped lesson, a teacher journals about how it felt to let go of lecturing time and observes how students responded to increased responsibility.

Start With Who You Are


Sustainable CPD begins with self-knowledge.
